Reception

This week we got left a special gift. It was a treasure chest full of pirate objects. It had some golden coins, a sword, a hook and a treasure map. We have written about our findings and plan to continue this next week. In Maths we have looked at some 2D shapes and learnt their properties

Year 1

This week Year 1 have had great fun being pirates. The children have fully engaged with this topic and enjoyed coming to school dressed up as pirates yesterday. We have sung pirate songs, read pirate books, played pirate phonics games and have even written some super sentences describing pirates. In Maths we have been continuing looking at numbers to 100 and this week looked at whether they were odd and even.

Year 2

This week in Year 2, we have enjoyed exploring the story of Peter Pan through Art, Computing and English. We have developed vocabulary using our senses, planned and written a fantastic opening to the story of Peter Pan, explored the use of water colour techniques and created our own moving pictures on Scratch. We have also learnt lots in R.E this week and we have made our own Diva Lamps.

Year 3

This week Year 3 have immersed themselves in the start of the Peter Pan story with a lot of discussion around the characters. We have started our Peter Pan inspired artwork by practising drawing figures in detail. Lots of skills being developed and improvements made already! We have learnt about inference in our guided reading which is a tricky skill to master. Year 3 are working hard!

Year 4


This week, year 4 have been busy completing work all about Peter Pan. We have analysed the characters of Peter Pan and Captain Hook and described the setting of the London sky and Neverland. In PE, we carried out an orienteering activities based on Peter Pan. In art, we have been experimenting with pastels, paints, foil and foam to create the texture of the moon. Within Maths, we have been working on sequences and we have just started looking at Roman numerals.

Year 5

It's been a very busy week in Year 5, we have been developing our own versions of the Peter Pan story and have created some unique adaptations. We have experimented with electrical circuits and tested the conductivity of different materials, ventured on treasure hunts across the school grounds and even calculated many different addition and subtraction problems. In Art, the class have created some beautiful pieces of Peter Pan art based on negative and positive space. In all, it's been a very busy and fun week!

Year 6

Wow, we have done so much in Year 6 this week; we are very proud of the hard work and effort everyone has put in. In English and Art, we have thrown ourselves into the world of Peter Pan. We have enjoyed creating our own Lost Boys and Girls and telling their stories. In Art, we have created silhouettes of characters and objects from Peter Pan and experimented with water colour backgrounds. In Maths, we have worked incredibly hard to tackle Long Division (a tricky concept, but we are doing very well!) Our Year 6 Teachers can't wait for next week, when we complete our own Peter Pan stories – they are looking amazing so far.
