Year 1

This week in Year 1 we have been innovating the story of the Bad-Tempered Ladybird. We chose new characters that the ladybird met and described them using adjectives. In Maths we have been telling the time to the o'clock and half past and continued reasoning and explaining. Our topic of Minibeasts has continued through our Art, Computing and Science work. In Year 1, we have also been talking about ways we can be respectful to our friends, in school and at home.

Year 2

Year 2 have enjoyed learning to read different scales in Maths this week. We have been learning to read thermometers and the children have worked hard to solve and explain problems involving temperature. The children have been great rally coaches this week! During our Topic lessons, we have loved learning about the 7 continents and we have started to learn about Africa.
