Reception

This week in EYFS we had a visitor to the classroom. A group of gingerbread biscuits visited and left us some clues to find. We had to think about why they were here and what they were running from. We made lost posters to help find them and wrote about The Gingerbread Man story. We have also done a science experiment looking at how the gingerbread biscuits react in water and milk. Mrs Duffy and Mr Parry did some baking this week with us, and we had to work together in teams to make some cakes. A busy week for Reception!

Year 1

This week in Year 1 we have continued with our Mini beast topic and have been retrieving facts in our guided reading session. This helped us to retrieve facts ready to plan and write our non fiction texts. In Maths we have been measuring; looking at objects that are taller and shorter and moving onto measuring using a ruler, writing our own success criteria. We have worked well together in our new rally coach pairs. In PSHE we have been talking about Friendship and talked about what it means to be a good friend.

Year 2

Year 2 enjoyed a visit to Stanah Country Park this week. They carried out a variety of exciting activities, such as making journey sticks, observational drawings of plants and going on a plant and minibeast hunt. The children also gathered lots of items to support them in making Bug Hotels back in school, as well as writing 'Riddle Sticks.' Year 2 attached their riddles to a tree for the public to enjoy - you might spot them if you are taking a visit to Stanah Country Park this weekend!

Year 3

This week in year 3, the children have shown lots of resilience with their new topic on angles. They have been introduced to the angle family and have been hunting for them around the classrooms. 3B had their last 'Healthy Heads' session and this week it was all about team work. 3L are still really enjoying their archery sessions on a Tuesday afternoon! Year 4

We have had a busy week in year 4, consolidating our understanding of angles, and practising measuring and drawing angles. We have begun to compare and describe shapes, including different quadrilaterals such as: squares, kites, and parallelograms. In our English lessons we have started to read a new novel set in ancient Egypt, 'The Time Travelling Cat and the Egyptian Goddess' by Julie Jarman. We are exploring how the author makes the story exciting and suspenseful. To go along with the changeable weather, we have been learning about the Water Cycle and the processes which create rain, clouds, rivers, and lakes. We will hopefully be completing our DT projects soon and look forward to sharing the results with you, after evaluating them of course!

Year 5

Metamorphosis has been the word in Year 5 this week; we've been exploring the life cycles of living things and have discovered the unusual process of metamorphosis in creatures, such as: frogs, dragonflies and butterflies. In English, we've begun to explore the life of David Attenborough - in preparation for our biography work next week. Maths has continued to be fraction focused and we are seriously impressed by Year 5's understanding of fraction conversions! Well done! Today, we shall be swimming again and look forward to seeing the fantastic progress the children are making in becoming confident swimmers.

Year 6

Have you ever wanted to go back in time? Well that's just what Year 6 have done with our new writing unit in Flashbacks. Through a survivor of the 2004 Thailand tsunami, we have learnt about the features of flashback stories and have enjoyed experimenting with personification. We have been incredibly busy in Maths, juggling both capacity and algebra! On top of all that, we are now experts in using 'Sigma' in spreadsheets and have been experimenting with different formulas for calculating data. Ask us all about it!
