VERY IMPORTANT MESSAGE

It appears that the number of positive Covid cases in our local area and in Blackpool is on the rise. There are an increasing number of schools who unfortunately are having to close bubbles and send children and staff home. Yesterday, Mrs Eaves had to close the nursery, breakfast and after school club. This has had an effect on school as several children, teaching staff (inc the management team) and support staff are classed as close contacts and are now self-isolating. This means that several staff are covering these roles.

In order to mitigate the increased risk and keep our bubbles in school, please can I remind families that the following measures **MUST** be followed:

- Please ensure that you socially distance from anyone other than your immediate household on the way to school, on school site and following collection;
- All contact with teaching staff will continue to be by phone and can be arranged through the school office. Please do not engage staff in conversation on the yard;
- If any child or family member tests positive, please inform us immediately by calling the school office.
- If a child has to self -isolate for the 10 day period as a close contact or has tested positive then remote learning will be set for them in accordance with our Remote Learning Policy. The same procedure is in place for a bubble that may need to isolate following DfE/PHE advice.
- If you need to visit school, please only 1 person in the foyer at a time.

Reception

This week reception have been looking at Dear zoo and sharing. We have learnt all about how to share a number into groups and explored this in different ways. We have continued to work on our phonics and keep practicing our tricky word reading and writing. In the afternoons we have been looking at Africa and how the animals live there. Outdoors we have enjoyed our open play and building our own zoo. We have so had Blue Moose Dance company in for our PE session and loved dancing to Jack and the beanstalk. Ask us about our dance.

Year 1

In Maths, this week the children have been recognising and using coins to buy fruits and vegetables. We turned our classrooms into fruit and toy shops and worked out what change we would need to give our friends. In science we have been learning about wild plants and identifying them around the school. The children have loved innovating their stories of Peter Rabbits Adventures alongside our reading and phonics assessments. A great week for Year 1!

Year 2

Year 2 have continued their work on 2D shapes, explored symmetry and they have investigated and made different pentagons, hexagons and octagons through a variety of activities. In English, they have enjoyed using role play, conscience ally and story mapping to re-tell the story of The Hunter. The children have really enjoyed learning about plants and are looking forward to planting and observing their own seeds in Science next week.

Year 3

This week in Year 3, the children have really enjoyed writing their persuasive poster on a chosen healthy food. Everyone now knows what we need to stay fit and healthy and that it is important to find a balance in your diet. On the topic of health, we have practiced our athletics skills ready for sports day in a few weeks.

Year 4

We have had another busy week in year 4, including the first of 6 weekly visits from Fleetwood Town FC. The community trust of FTFC will be working with the children on a project called Move & Learn, finding out about how to be active and healthy. In Maths, we have completed our shape and space unit by looking at translation and translating shapes. We have begun to plan and develop ideas for our classical poem (based on Looking-Glass River, by R L Stevenson.) in English this week and will be writing and editing them next week. All the children are enjoying science this half-term, learning about living things. This week we have created our own flow-diagrams to sort living things by their features.

Year 5

"THIS IS SPARTA!" cried the majority of Year 5. This week, the children have been in fierce debate over whether they would be a Spartan or Athenian warrior and it seems the Spartans are certainly in the lead! We've spent time building our Ancient Greek shields - ready for our eventual 'battle.' In Maths, the word of the week has been 'angles' - we've perfected our accuracy in using a protractor and are now confidently measuring and drawing our own angles! In English, we have been enthralled by Ancient Greek mythology and its links to our modern idioms. Overall, it's been a busy week and we're all very excited for another week of learning!

Year 6

This week, our Year Six teachers have been blown away by the dedication and resilience of all children in Year Six, as they completed their Year Six SATS week. We can truly say with confidence that they should all be very proud of themselves and what they have achieved this year. To finish off what our week of hard work, we have thoroughly enjoyed our 'Science Day', where we became 'Light Detectives' to solve a mystery crime.
