Reception

We have had a great week practising for sports day. We are so excited! We have worked hard recapping our basic skills this week, we have made so much progress over this year. We have been looking at farm animals and learning facts about them.

Year 1

Sunflowers have been the theme in Year 1 this week. Earlier this week the children planted sunflower seeds, where we learnt what a flower needs to be able to grow. We then looked at the different part of a sunflower through a reading lesson. In our art lesson we have been looking at sunflowers in detail and sketching them. The children enjoyed their first sports day practise and showed great teamwork and resilience.

Year 3

We have had such a busy week in Year 3! We loved looking at the parts of a plant and dissecting them. We used the magnifying glasses to look more closely at them and found the ovary and the stamen. We have also continued our writing topic on biographies and have enjoyed creating a whole class fictional character to write about.

Year 4

We have all had another busy week in year 4. In Maths, we have continued with our learning about shape and space, finding the perimeter and area of rectangles and rectilinear shapes. At the moment, our English text type is persuasive writing. We have looked at examples and identified the features specific to this style of writing. Next week we will be working together to persuade people that we should not have to wear a school uniform! We have had some great PE lessons, learning the skills of batting, bowling, and fielding, and applying these skills in small-sided games of cricket. Science has been about animals and their habitats; we have been discovering and identifying the small animals that live on the school grounds!

Year 5

Writing has been the focus of this week; we're finally beginning to write our Greek mythological stories and the children have been excited to get pen-to-paper. Our big focus, at the moment, is on 'up-levelling' our vocabulary and trying to link it into our writing. In Maths, we've been continuing our work on geometry and have begun to translate and reflect shapes in different quadrants. We've enjoyed some fantastic Rounders games throughout the week and look forward to playing many more! The children have worked exceptionally hard and we're very proud of their work ethic at the moment.

Year 6

Year Six have thoroughly enjoyed practicing for their Sports Day this week, especially in the glorious sunshine we have had! The children and teachers are determined to make their last Primary School Sports Day full of fun, teamwork and competition. Things continued to be sporty elsewhere in our History lessons this week, where we researched the German invasion tactic of Blitzkrieg, or 'Lighting War', as it is commonly named. Using a tag rugby invasion game as our stimulus, we put this into practice to uncover the most effective tactics and points of attack. We are very excited about our Residential to Borwick Hall next week, (some of us have even started packing) and we are ready for the exciting challenges before us over the final weeks of term.
