## Despite the current Covid 19 restrictions, we are still busy in School...

### Reception

Reception this week have continued to learn about Animals and write their own fact books about farm animals. We have looked at the artist Peter Diem and his cow paintings. We loved looking at the different patterns and colours he has used. We have completed some home learning near the end of the week and the children adapted to change so well ! We are super proud of them but can't wait to have them back in on Monday.

**Year 1**

This week in Year 1, we have been painting sunflowers both with paint and the paint programme on the laptops. We have been investigating different leaves and trees that we have in the school grounds and we are happy to see that our sunflowers are growing well.

In maths we have been learning about capacity and volume and enjoyed experimenting with the water using mathematical vocabulary.

**Year 2**

Year 2 have been amazing this week! They have adapted very quickly to home learning and shown a huge level of enthusiasm. It has been wonderful to watch them be creative, enjoy using Wordart and find out about position and direction in Maths. They have worked hard in English and we have loved reading the children's character descriptions and similes poems! In addition to this, we have been impressed with their Science skills and enjoyed hearing about their investigations. You really are awesome, Year 2!

**Year 3**

This week in Year 3 the children have loved creating their own character for their independent biography. They have really impressed the Year 3 teachers with their use of when and where fronted adverbials. They have also shown so much enthusiasm towards learning to tell the time to the minute. It has proven tricky but we are determined to persevere with it. We have continued with our plants topic and looked at how water is transported through the stem to the flower for it to survive. Keep up the determination and enthusiasm for the last week of challenges Year 3!

**Year 4**

We have had an exciting week in English, writing a text to persuade the reader that England will win Euro 2020 (so far, so good). In Maths we have been learning about time and money - both very important life skills as the children get older. We have concluded our Science unit, Living Things and Their Habitat, by looking at how the environmental changes that people have caused have affected other species. Our geography this week has been about the different features that can be found on the course of a river and finding the meaning of new river vocabulary.

**Year 5**

We've had a creative week in Year 5. To start off, we did a bit of acting to a selection of nature poems by various poets before getting artsy and designing our own Greek vases. This afternoon, we held our very own football tournament and got in the mood for the Euros final by doing some fun activities.
